
Surgical Skills Training Center University of Southern California Los Angeles, California



API provided Programming, Planning, Architectural, Engineering and Interior Design services to construct the first of its kind in the world, state-of-the-art surgical skills training center in an existing subterranean parking garage. Constructed in 1951, the existing building did not have the infrastructure to support the project requirements. The challenge was in providing two separate new HVAC systems; one with recirculating air designed for occupied spaces and another one for an animal holding area and operating room with 100% fresh air intake. All within the restricted slab to slab clearance of a parking garage and still provide adequate ceiling height to install surgical lights and audio/visual equipment to broadcast the procedures to other spaces within the University and outside. The facility includes a six station operating room for surgeries and endoscopy procedures, a twentyfour station dry lab with adjustable eight workstations, an animal hold room and support spaces.
